Convene

Tour of Primate Center

Jordana Lenon, Public Information, Outreach and Editorial Specialist, conducted the tour. She explained that Wisconsin is a pioneer in many fields of human health research, both mental and physical, and part of that is driven by the Wisconsin National Primate Research Center. Due to this work, there have been breakthroughs in understanding the human aging process, many aspects of female reproductive health, neurology, Parkinson's disease and global infectious disease like Ebola or the Zika virus and more.

Wisconsin's center is one of a seven in a national network. It was formed in the early 1960s by Congress and is funded, in part, by the National Institutes of Health.

The committee learned about the marmosets and macaques housed at the center and also toured a lab building but did not step into any of the clean labs. The tour included a stop at the lab where developmental biologist Jamie Thomson first derived a line of a human stem cells, opening a new field of exploration.
