

RESOLUTIONS AGAINST DISCRIMINATION IN UW-MADISON ROTC PROGRAMS

1. The University of Wisconsin-Madison Academic Staff Assembly requests the Board of Regents to direct the University of Wisconsin-Madison Chancellor, in consultation with the Wisconsin State Legislature, to identify ways in which the University of Wisconsin-Madison can meet its land-grant obligations to include "military tactics" while neither tolerating nor allowing discrimination based on sexual identity.
2. The University of Wisconsin-Madison Academic Staff Assembly requests the Board of Regents to continue to request the President of the University of Wisconsin System to contact and work with Wisconsin's congressional delegation to attempt to change the federal policy that allows discrimination based on sexual identity and to attempt to change the ROTC programs.
3. The UW-Madison Academic Staff Executive Committee and the Academic Staff Assembly wish to indicate their support for UW-Madison ROTC programs. We believe these programs are valuable for individual students and the UW-Madison, and we believe that the presence of UW-Madison graduates in the military service contributes to a more enlightened and effective military. We are troubled, however, over wholly inappropriate discrimination on the grounds of sexual identity established by the Department of Defense. We believe that sexual identity is a clear example of one of the many freedoms that the military was established to protect.
4. The Academic Staff Executive Committee and the Academic Staff Assembly are committed to sustained efforts that will lead to the elimination of these discriminatory policies. In the strongest possible terms, we urge the UW-Madison Chancellor and the Board of Regents to communicate our position to Wisconsin's congressional delegation, the Secretaries of the Army, Navy and Air Force, and those members of Congress responsible for federal legislation regarding the armed services. We also urge the Chancellor and the Board of Regents to contact chancellors and regents at other land-grant universities in order to generate a broader base of support in working toward the elimination of a federal policy that infringes upon a citizen's right to a personal sexual identity.

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
