

ACADEMIC STAFF ASSEMBLY BYLAWS CHANGE PROPOSALS

NOTE: Bylaws changes last April 17 extended the time frame for ASEC elections to "not later than March 15." The Nominating Committee's responsibility to have a slate prepared "not later than the November Assembly meeting" was not changed, however, and should be moved to a later Assembly meeting.

1) PROPOSED CHANGES IN ARTICLE IV., SECTION 6. B. 1.:

Substitute "the December Assembly meeting each year, or the January Assembly meeting if the December meeting has been cancelled." for: "the November Assembly meeting each year."

2) BYLAWS CHANGES NECESSARY FOR CHANGING CEBC AND PPPC TO NINE MEMBERS

a) COMPENSATION AND ECONOMIC BENEFITS COMMITTEE (CEBC)

ARTICLE V. SECTION 5.:

B. Membership

1. The Committee shall consist of ~~eight (8)~~ **nine (9)** members elected by the Assembly from a slate prepared by the Nominating Committee, with ~~one-third~~ **one-third** of the Committee being elected each year.

D. Terms of Office

The CEBC terms will run from July 1 to June 30. Members will serve for ~~two~~ three years. ~~From the time of election or until the next regular election~~ ~~the term will run until the next regular election~~

b) PERSONNEL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES COMMITTEE (PPPC)

ARTICLE V. SECTION 6.:

B. Membership

1. This Committee shall consist of ~~eight (8)~~ **nine (9)** members elected by the Assembly from a slate prepared by the Nominating Committee, with ~~one-third~~ **one-third** of the Committee being elected each year.

D. Terms of Office

The PPPC terms will run from July 1 to June 30. Members will serve for ~~two~~ three years. ~~from the time of election or until the next regular election for that seat on the Committee.~~

- c) PROVISOS: The transition from eight to nine members will take place as follows:

1. The 1991 spring election will have a minimum of ten candidates. The three candidates receiving the most votes and eligible to serve under Article V. Section 6.B.4., will be elected for three years (July 1, 1991 to June 30, 1994). The next two candidates receiving the most votes and eligible to serve under Article V. Section 6.B.4., will be elected for two years (July 1, 1991 to June 30, 1993).
2. The 1992 spring election will have a minimum of eight candidates. The three candidates receiving the most votes and eligible to serve under Article V. Section 6.B.4., will be elected for three years (July 1, 1992 to June 30, 1995). The next candidate receiving the most votes and eligible to serve under Article V. Section 6.B.4., will be elected for one year (July 1, 1992 to June 30, 1993).
3. Beginning with the 1993 spring election, three members will be elected each year for three year terms.
