**FRANCINE HARTMAN**

I am a Senior Editor at the University Publications Office, where I've worked as an academic staff member for the last seven years. I have not been involved in Academic Staff governance work previously, but I am interested in being of service to the group. I am interested in many issues facing academic staff, and I believe it is important to advocate for shared governance, equal compensation and job security. The Publications Office serves the entire campus, and I have contact with faculty and staff from many departments and disciplines. I think I would be a good source of information for the Nominating Committee, since I have a broad view of the work being done on this campus. **BARRY ROBINSON**

I have been a member of the academic staff for over 13 years. I am currently the Business and Public Relations Manager for University Theatre in the Department of Theatre and Drama. I currently serve as Chair of the Academic Staff Assembly Nominating Committee. I served as District 11 Assembly Representative for three years. I am also currently serving as a member of the Academic Staff Title Review Committee.

My campus activities have been directed towards obtaining P.I. status for academic staff and more job security (and salary security) for soft money academic staff. Another interest is in raising the level of awareness of the Legislature and of the general public of the role that academic staff play in the teaching and research done on this campus.

I would like to serve on the Nominating Committee to help with the continuing effort to get more people involved with academic staff participation in university governance.

## **JAN WHEATON**

Since January of 1967, it has been my great pleasure to serve the University as a member of the academic staff; as a Teaching Specialist (pre Hayes-Hill), as Coordinator/Director of Minority/Disadvantaged Student Programs for the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences (CALs), as a CALs Academic Affairs Assistant Dean, as Associate Athletic Director--Academic & Student Affairs, and now as an Assistant Dean of Students. I have been involved in academic staff governance from the beginning of our hard-earned participation rights, serving on the Academic Staff Executive Committee (ASEC) for the past six years--two as ASEC Chair. I've "lobbied" the Legislature and the regents, testified before the Governor's Commission on Accountability, served on University and System screening committees, and was the campus academic staff representative to UW-System for two years. I've had an unbelievable opportunity to become familiar with both the University and her dedicated staff. I am particularly interested in helping to increase the participation of academic staff of color.
