Since January of 1967, it has been my great pleasure to serve the university as a member of the academic staff; as a Teaching Specialist (pre Hayes-Hill), as Coordinator/Director of Minority/Disadvantaged Student Programs for the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences (CALs), as a CALs Academic Affairs Assistant Dean, as Associate Athletic Director--Academic & Student Affairs, and now as an Assistant Dean of Students. I have been involved in academic staff governance for the beginning of our hard-earned participation rights, serving on the Academic Staff Executive Committee (ASEC) for our first six years--two as ASEC chair.
