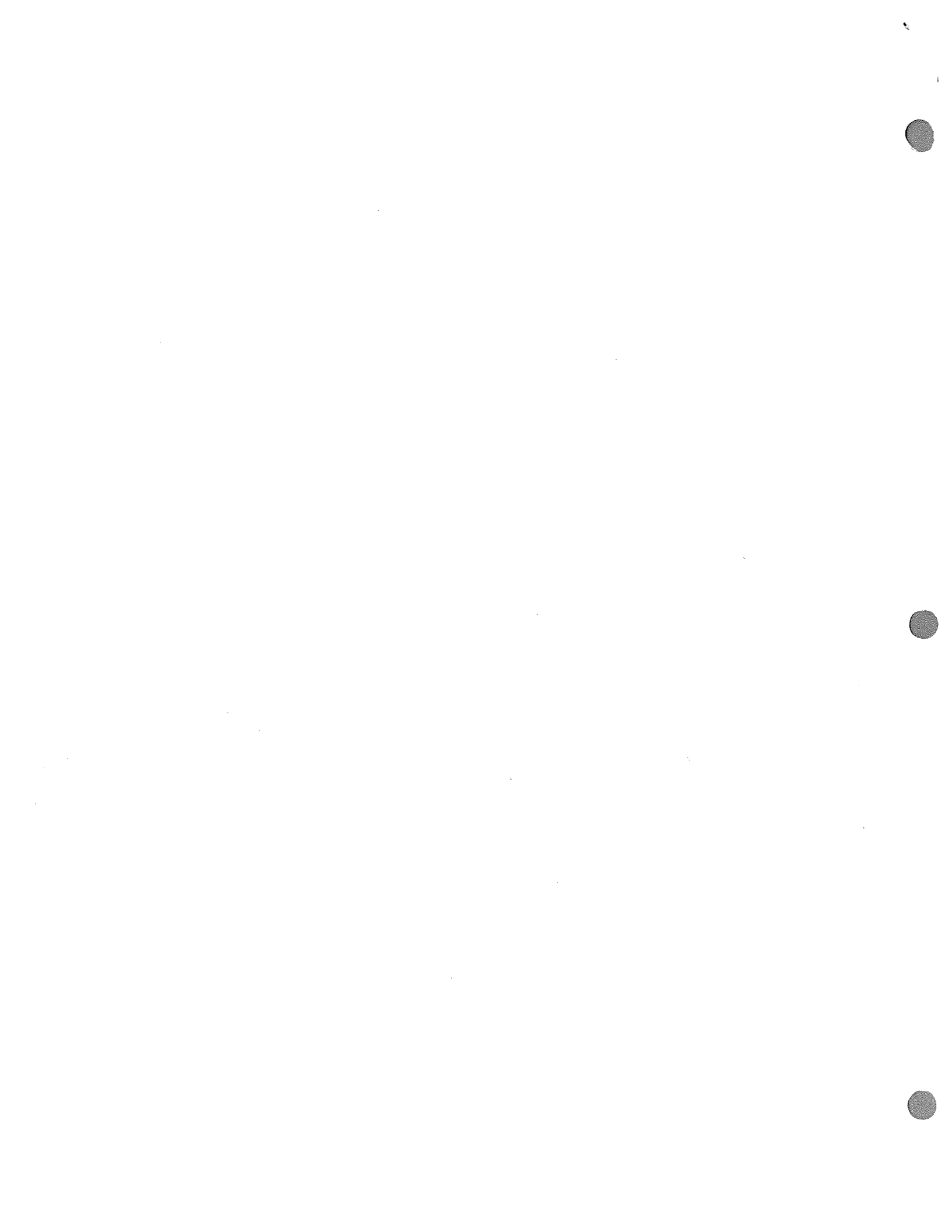

I am a Systems Programmer in the Department of Biostatistics and Medical Informatics where I have been for just over two years. In this position, I have daily interaction with faculty, staff and both undergraduate and graduate students.

While I do not have any prior experience with assembly committees, I see this position as a chance to become more involved with campus and academic staff affairs. I believe my involvement in several departmental committees gives me a strong basis from which I can contribute to this effort.

Steve Barnet

I have worked in the technical support department of the Space Science and Engineering Center since 1995. I am currently the senior system support specialist and supervisor of the department. My duties include the development and maintenance of network infrastructure as well as collaboration with researchers to design systems capable of meeting the unique challenges of a research environment. In addition to system design and maintenance, I am responsible for developing policies for general computing usage and system support.

These policies must be flexible enough to meet the needs of our researchers as well as provide a framework for reliable system operation. I believe that my experience working with people to develop systems that are flexible and equitable provides a solid background for contribution to the Districting and Representation Committee.

Anne Gunther

My work in Letters and Science Administration involves analysis of a large amount of aggregate data including budget, appointment system, payroll and student data. This background has served me well on the Districting and Representation Committee. My familiarity with various campus data sources has also been helpful in understanding how to improve the reliability of the data the DRC receives and uses to district academic staff, as well as the data we make available on our Web site.

I created and am responsible for maintenance of the Public District Profiles document which summarizes the composition of the various districts. I have developed expertise in reviewing existing districts for logic and consistency, and have become a valuable resource for exploring questions and issues as they arise.

I would like to serve another term on the DRC to finalize some of our long-term objectives, including making districting issues and information as accessible as possible to all members of the academic staff, as well as to Assembly representatives. As a member of the academic staff at large (I am not a representative), I believe I bring an independent perspective to the committee.

I am a lecturer in the Law School, where I have worked since 1979 teaching legal writing and providing individualized instruction services. I have represented Academic Staff district 274 for several terms, and previously served on several ad hoc committees for the Assembly. Currently I am serving as chair of the Districting and Representation Committee.

I am running for re-election to this committee to: (1) help maintain a smooth districting process through the upcoming transition to a new Secretary of the Academic Staff, (2) help complete the documentation needed to maintain the districting process in the future, (3) continue working with Assembly and ASEC members to enhance communication about issues and information related to districting, and (4) help the committee transition from a focus on maintenance of the districts to addressing other districting issues
