JACQUELYN HANK

I held two terms on the Professional Development and Recognition Standing Committee and co-chaired this committee in 2000-2001. As a chair of this standing committee, I attended many of the ASEC meetings and had the opportunity to learn much about the ongoing activities of academic staff shared governance. I am currently a member of the Medical School CASI. With my experience and long standing interactions with various campus groups, I feel that I am qualified and could contribute to this committee that has the responsibility of nominating members of the academic staff for election to ASEC and the Assembly and for election or appointment to other UW-Madison committees.

MARCIA JEZWINSKI

In order to gain a variety of perspectives on the topic, it's important to have a broad variety of experience from many people focused to accomplish the charge of the committee. Serving on committees gives an individual opportunities to have a voice and to make a difference.

I have been a member of the academic staff since 1986 serving as an Administrative Officer, Director of Human Resources for the Division of Information Technology. In this position, I have had the opportunity to organize different committees and groups for a common purpose ensuring a solid variety of opinions and perspectives along with the appropriate expertise to accomplish the charge to the committee. In this capacity, I also have the great opportunity to know all of our staff to a certain extent.

I have served on the Personnel Policies and Procedures Committee for a number of terms and am the ASA representative for district 451.

MARSHA LANDRETTI

I am a Senior Administrative Program Specialist in the Civil and Environmental Engineering Department. I have been an academic staff member for fifteen years. I have been president of MASA, have served on the Personnel, Policy and Procedure Committee, have been a member of the College of Engineering Equity and Diversity Committee, and currently I am a member of the College of Engineering Committee on Academic Staff Issues (CASI) and the Union Council. I have enjoyed being involved in academic staff governance and would like to recruit other academic staff to participate. I feel that it is important that academic staff feel connected to the University and understand that their participation can make a difference. As a member of the Nominating Committee, I will have the opportunity to share my experiences with other academic staff. I believe that academic staff involvement in decision-making can only strengthen the University.

MARY BARNARD RAY

My current title is senior lecturer in the Law School, and I have worked there since 1978. I have served as the Representative of District 274 since the early 80's, and during that time I have seen the important contributions that academic staff members can make as members of governance committees. I appreciate the importance of the Nominating Committee's responsibility to find talented representatives for all those committees. Through my decade of work as member and then Chair of the Districting and Representation Committee, I have come to admire the enormous and diverse pool of talent that the academic staff represents. For example, the DRC work has taught me the difference between instrumentation innovators and instrumentation specialists, between researchers and lab managers, and between clinical professors (CHS) and clinical professors. If elected to the Nominating Committee, I will use this broader knowledge to help the committee find new candidates, to find candidates from academic staff areas that may be currently under represented on committees, and to match the candidates' talents to the particular needs of each position.

TORI RICHARDSON

I am currently the Assistant Dean for Chadbourne Residential College and a member of the L&S General Dean staff, a position that I have held since July 2001. Prior to assuming my new responsibilities, I served as the Assistant Director for Academic Affairs in the Office of International Studies and Programs for approximately five years and as an academic advisor in Cross-College Advising Service for two years. All of these positions have given me the opportunity to work with undergraduate students and to assist them in getting connected to their particular academic interests and the greater UW-Madison community.

I have been actively involved in academic staff governance on the Madison campus in numerous ways. For the past three years, I have been serving on the Nominating Committee as an active member working with colleagues to encourage other academic staff members to become more active in shared governance at the University. During the same time period, I have also been involved with MACAA where I serve as the secretary/treasurer for this cross-campus advising group. Since starting full-time employment at the UW, I have been a member of SPA and most recently MASA. Because of my past and current experiences on the UW-Madison campus and my strong interest in getting other colleagues connected through shared governance, I believe that I would continue to be an effective team player on the Nominating Committee.
