I have been a member of the academic staff and the Office of the Secretary of the Faculty since 1996. My role encompasses partnering with a broad array of colleagues to develop events and programs for faculty, coordinating mentoring and networking activities, and supporting the work of diversity and inclusion-related shared governance committees, including the Committee on Women in the University, Committee for GLBTQ People in the University, and, starting this fall, the Campus Diversity & Climate Committee. Fostering engagement and striving to make UW-Madison a more habitable place for work and learning link these diverse responsibilities.

Over the past two decades, I've served on several campus-level advisory committees and work groups – notably the University Child Care Committee (2002-present), Reaccreditation Theme Team 5: Building a Welcoming, Respectful, and Empowered UW-Madison Community (2009), Human Resources Design Project Benefits Team (2012), and ad hoc "Bullying" Committee (2014). Currently, I represent academic staff on the Family Leave work group, which I co-chair with Workforce Relations Director Patrick Sheehan.
