On June 18, 2019, leaders of UW–Madison and the Ho-Chunk Nation joined together to dedicate the Our Shared Future heritage marker. The plaque recognizes campus land as the ancestral home of the Ho-Chunk, acknowledging the circumstances that led to their forced removal and honoring their history of resistance and resilience.

During the 2019–20 academic year, the plaque will travel to locations across campus to increase its visibility and to begin incorporating its message into the university’s teaching mission.
