ON THE DEATH OF PROFESSOR EMERITUS HOWARD L. STONE

Howard L. Stone, professor emeritus of academic affairs, UW School of Medicine and Public Health, passed away January 13, 2008.

Howard was born on December 2, 1927. He received his BS degree in education in 1952 and an MS degree in education counseling and guidance in 1960 from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

After graduating from Wisconsin in 1952, Howard joined the Wauwatosa Public Schools as a teacher of social studies and English. He served as a school counselor, assistant high school principal, and the director of secondary education and as assistant superintendent of schools for instructional services.

Howard received his PhD in educational administration in 1970 from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He joined the University of Wisconsin Medical School as a lecturer in 1970. In 1973 he achieved the rank of associate professor with tenure in the University of Wisconsin-Extension, and in 1987 he was promoted to professor, educational resources, in the Medical School. Howard served as the assistant vice chancellor for educational resources in the Center for Health Sciences from 1973-1977 and provided guidance to the schools of nursing and pharmacy as well as to the Medical School.

Howard established a national reputation as a scholar in medical education. He published multiple articles in the field and was invited to speak at numerous conferences, seminars and workshops for the Association of American Medical Colleges. In addition, Howard served as the chair of the AAMC Central Group on Medical Education from 1984-86.

Howard was a valued colleague who contributed greatly to the education of health professions students at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and used his expertise to improve the quality of education at the national level.
