ON THE DEATH OF PROFESSOR EMERITUS PAUL H. WALGENBACH

Professor Emeritus Paul H. Walgenbach passed away peacefully on April 14, 2008 in Oakwood Village East Center in Madison, Wisconsin. Originally from Peru, Illinois, Professor Walgenbach earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in business administration from Northwestern University and his Ph.D. in accounting from the University of Illinois. Paul served as an aviation cadet and as a lieutenant in the Army Air Corps during World War II. He also taught at Butler University for 3 years.

Professor Walgenbach then joined the faculty at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and for the next 35 years was an outstanding educator and teacher. He was also a visiting professor at the University of Michigan. Professor Walgenbach served for several years as secretary-treasurer of the American Accounting Association. Paul was a co-author of two widely used college accounting textbooks, comprising 13 U.S. editions and 2 Canadian and Australian editions. Paul was a certified public accountant, serving on several committees of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, most notably, on the CPA examination committee.
