5. Professor Ed Friedman raised the issue with more focused scope of the ethnic studies requirement. He said that at a time when increasing internationalization is a strategic priority for the university, the study of ethnicity in other countries should be allowed and that this would often be an effective way of getting students to understand ethnic problems in the U.S.

After discussion, Dean Certain asked if anyone wanted to make a motion. No one did, but Ed Friedman asked for a straw poll. On the question of whether the University Senate should debate the scope of the ethnic studies requirement, the vote was 17 yes, 5 no, 4 abstain. On the vote in favor of returning to the 1996 definition, the vote was 13 yes, 5 no, 6 abstain.
