Program Review

All UW-Madison Academic Programs must be reviewed every 10 years. Reviews are convened by the dean upon the recommendation of the associate dean, in consideration of the schedule for review maintained by the Provost. The program faculty prepares a self-study narrative that is provided to a faculty review committee and is used as the foundation for a report to the dean. The APC reviews and discusses the self-study, review committee report, and the program's response to the report. Members advise the dean and associate deans about program strengths, contributions student learning in the discipline, and what might be done to promote improvement.
